## SOCIETY VICTORY ON LECALÉ COAST ~~~~~!

The Environment Minister Edwin Poots has backed the stand taken by the Lecale & Downe Historical Society in the Lecale Coast controversy. In December the Society formally objected to the Northern Ireland Environment Agency's proposal to remove the Tyrella/Minerstown section of the Lecale coast and its visual hinterland from the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. The December meeting of the Society backed this action. Copies of the Society letter were sent to public representatives and Society member Eddie McGrady MP gave full support to our objections.

### Lecale Garden

The garden of Michael and Geraldine Galloway, 1 Ballytristan Road, Downpatrick will be open on Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> May – 2pm to 5pm under the National Trust's Ulster Garden Scheme.

This unique 7 acre garden lies four miles east of Downpatrick in the countryside of Lecale where it was created by Dr Magill over the last five decades of the Twentieth Century. He transformed a disused quarry into a large sheltered amphitheatre surrounded by trees and shrubs. The garden is noted for its collection of rhododendrons. Views into the garden as well as to the surrounding countryside are obtained from a circular path through the trees around the quarry rim. The present owners are rebuilding the house and have carried out considerable peripheral planting of native trees.

The garden is partially suitable for wheelchairs but children must be strictly supervised in view of the dangerous cliff faces.

**Location:** From Downpatrick follow the B1 Ardglass Road, but instead of turning right at the Downshire Hospital continue straight on towards Bishops Court and Ballyhornan. After Ballyalton turn left at the next crossroads into Ballytristan Road and the garden is on the right.
